
The aliens joined us in Nursery and we sang "5 little men in a flying saucer!" We enjoyed whooshing into space!

Reception are excited about Christmas we made paper chains and counted the loops.






Art

- I liked doing the art because it was impressive to see the detail that Clifford Possum Tjapaltjarri managed.


Year 4 - Top 3 Learning Moments




Year 4 - Top 3 Learning Moments




Mr Banks' highlight: He enjoyed line dancing because the children have seen dance in a new light/ perspective. He also loved the energy each lesson.

- We got to touch the moon! (Bella)






- Our trip to Winchester science museum

Our trip to Winchester Science Museum


- The planetarium was great because we learnt even more about the planets and found out that Uranus used to be called George after King George III (Dylan)

- "I learnt that the thing that keeps the wheels together and lets them rotate is an axle." Polly


