### Key achievements this academic year 2021/22:

- We affiliated to the West Berks Sports Network again this academic year. This enabled us to engage in a range of sporting activities and competitions including competitive sports with other West Berks schools during the year
- We developed and improved our PE curriculum by widening the range of sports planned and taught –
- We purchased additional resources for physical activity at lunchtimes. This enabled ALL children to be physically active at lunchtimes, participating in a range of skills/games base activities.
- Senior Sports leader disseminated CPD to support the teaching of football and athletics across the school to teaching staff focussing on planned differentiation and the clarity of pitch across 3 different age ranges/phases.
- Senior Sports leader completed joint planning with staff to develop the quality of planning for specific sports such as football, athletics, badminton, volleyball, dance
- We purchased new equipment to enable us to include new sports in our curriculum/as part of our extra-curricular activities hurdles, badminton, skipping, archery, javelin, shotput
- We achieved our Silver Sports Mark in this academic year
- We identified children who are exceptionally able/talented in sport/PE and have implemented curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities to meet their
- We purchased additional top up sessions to provide extra swimming over and above national curriculum requirements for a targeted year group
