In Literacy we will be:



Writing to entertain and inform

- Focusing on stories from other cultures and writing our own narrative texts.
- Writing diary entries from the perspective of characters in an Egyptian story.
- Writing information texts about Egyptians.
- Writing simple biographies about historical figures.
- To write and perform poetry.
- Developing our handwriting, spelling and grammar skills as part of our general literacy session and through targeted lessons.
- Exploring a range of texts and developing our reading skills through text immersion sessions and reading fluency lessons.

In Numeracy we will be:

- Year 3 - To learn formal methods for multiplication and division. To use length and perimeter. To be able to use fractions. To be able to use money as a unit of measure.
- Year 4 - To learn formal methods for multiplication and division. To use length and perimeter. To be able to use fractions.
- Focusing on learning and quick recall of our times tables.

International Primary Curriculum (IPC) Topic - Temples, Tombs and Treasures



As part of our learning in Technology we'll be:

- Designing and making an Egyptian Shaduf.

As part of our learning in History we'll be:

- Finding out the Ancient Egyptian lifestyle and culture and what might have influenced them to settle in Egypt.
- Finding out about the Egyptian era and who the significant people were and the key events that happened.

As part of our International learning we'll be:

- Finding out about food, weather, culture and the geographical location of Egypt.
- To compare rivers in the home and host countries.

As part of our learning in Art we'll be:

- Looking at how to show light and dark in sketches.
- Drawing by touch and feel.
- Exploring colour and creating their own god/goddess, with a stylised animal head.



As part of our learning in Computing, we'll be:

- In year 3 - Learning to use the basic functions of PowerPoint including: text boxes, images, shapes, sounds, and transitions to create and share information based on our IPC topic.
- In year 4 - Learning about staying safe online and making the right choices.

In Religious Education we will be:

- We will be learning about why the Guru Granth Sahib is important to the Sikh religion.
- We will be learning about why Easter is important to the Christian religion.

In Science we will be learning:

- How and why different materials are used.
- How to test the properties of a material.
- About the uses for glass and plastic.
- About the metals that are attracted to magnets.
- Which materials allow electricity to pass through them.
- Which materials allow heat to pass through them.
- Understand that energy is generated.
- Know the names of the components and related symbols in a circuit.
- To be able use electrical circuits.

In P.E we will be:

- Developing our team work skills and tactics through playing basketball, wall ball and Kwik cricket.
- Learning fundamental badminton, basketball, wall ball and cricket skills.
- Learning a variety of team games.



In RSHE we will be:

- Year 3 - Learning about responsibilities and boundaries. As well as different types of relationships.
- Year 4 - Learning about friendship difficulties and our own identity.

We will all be learning about how to live independently and travelling by bus.

MFL (French) we will be

- Year 3 - Key words that relate to our family and friends.
- Year 4 - Key words that relate to going shopping

In Music we will be:

- Learning to play the steel pans.
- Developing our understanding of pitch and rhythm and working collaboratively in an ensemble.
