Summer Term 2024 Familiar tales!

We will listen to stories with attention and

recall and tell long stories. We will retell stories using puppets and props and using language from books. We will learn and sing a range of songs and rhymes linked to our topics. We will learn and sing songs for our routines – tidying up, line up, books away We will build vocabulary and use talk to question why and describe what we notice We will hold conversations using 4-6 words and continue it for many turns. We will use talk to organise play e.g. who will play "goldilocks" and who will be the "Bears"

Bears

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Focus books

Physical

We will jump with 2 feet together / over hurdles
We will explore different sensory/tactile materials
We will roll, cut and shape dough to help develop our fine motor skills.
We will use one handed tools and equipment safely.
We will cut with scissors and develop a 1 handed hold.
We will use gross motor skills to wave large pieces of fabric/ribbons
We will learn how to climb and balance safely.
We will skip, hop and stand on one leg

We will learn how to safely complete an obstacle course

Personal Social and Emotional

We will be following the routines and expectations of nursery. We will begin to share with support from adults and sand timers. We will take turns eg using the slide We will talk about our feelings and notice other's feelings We will use equipment appropriately for a task. We will work on parting confidently from parents/carers We will work closely on working together and building friendships. We will learn to use the toilets in nursery with maximum independence We can talk positively about our achievements eg copying dragon dance.

Literacy

We will listen to familiar tales and join in with familiar refrains or retell in our own words.
We will show an understanding of how stories are structured with a beginning middle and end.
We will talk about characters in the story and create pictures of key characters.
We will work on writing for different purposes. We will write our own names; make our own story books; make lists or notes on clipboards.

We will look at rhyme and alliteration in stories that we read.

We will look at fiction and non fiction books – noticing pictures and print. We will Turn pages in books from front to back and track

Maths

We will explore shape and describe the properties of shapes - round, pointy, flat.. We will look at weight and use terms heavier, heavy, light We will compare sizes - big, small, middle sized. We will look at length - long, short, longer, shorter. We will count to 10 and count down from 10 We will subitise to 5 and notice how much of a 10 frame is filled/emptu. We will notice number symbols of importance and match numbers to amounts. We will use and follow positional language

Building e.g. boats with junk modelling,/ castles with blocks, lego Learn to start and stop when playing instruments. Listening and identifying sounds outdoors Colour mixing- what happens when colours mix together? Collage pictures Using tools competently and appropriately and talking about how we made models. Role play - Goldilocks, Jack climbing the beanstalk, wolf and pigs..

Inderstanding of the world

We will look at changes to our environment and closely observe things that we plant and grow. We will show care and concern for living things and observe the lifecycle of the caterpillar.

We will notice signs of Summer and talk about keeping safe in warm weather appropriate clothing/drinking water. We will explore water and capacity. We will look at floating and sinking and make our own boats. In Nursery we offer the children a wide range of learning opportunities which they are able to access during the session. We aim to follow the children's interests and introduce some new experiences to build

skills and develop awareness. Don't forget to look at Seesaw to see what your child has been doing in class and to upload your home learning to Seesaw - we love to see the things you do together!
