PE and Sports Premium Planned Expenditure 2021/22

The Government provides substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is provided for schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- New or additional sports clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/Sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/Sport
- Running sports competitions, or increasing participation in school games/sports
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs

How will we be spending the Sports Funding and who will benefit?

The school believes that the money must be used so that: all children benefit regardless of sporting ability; that all children have access to regular physical activity in school and extra-curricular activities after school, the most able children are given the opportunity to compete in advanced tournaments; that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development; swimming is funded in order to ensure all pupils access opportunities to develop their ability to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres. The school will use the funding to ensure that it promotes and develops healthy lifestyles in all of the children.

The table below shows how we intend to spend the sports funding during 2021-22.

Key indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school

- To ensure all KS1 and KS2 children engage in regular physical activity at lunchtimes - funding will be used to employ a senior sports leader and a specialist sports coach to continue to provide lunchtime clubs/activities for all children in KS1/KS2

Key indicator 2: The profile of PESSPA being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

- Funding will be used to employ a senior sports leader and a specialist sports coach – ensuring the continued development of a high quality PE curriculum and a range of sporting opportunities alongside existing primary teachers
- Funding will be used to release the Senior Sports Leader to monitor the quality of education in PE across the school – identifying priorities for SDP and evaluating progress over time
- Funding will be also used to affiliate to the West Berks Sports Network – enabling the school to develop the level of competitive sports it offers all children (working towards our Bronze/Silver Level Sports Mark)

Key indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

- Teachers to receive high quality CPD opportunities to develop their confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE/sport
- Funding will be used to disseminate Football CPD across the school – including staff training sessions led by Senior Sports Leader
- Funding will be used to release the Senior Sports Leader to monitor the quality of Gym teaching across the school and provide coaching/team teaching to improve skills of other staff
- Funding will be used to release the Senior Sports Leader to provide CPD through the development of joint and supported planning to ensure high quality sequences of learning that target and improve skills in PE
- Funding will be used to access CPD opportunities through the West Berks Sports Network – PE Conference and twilight training sessions

Key indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

- Funding will be used to purchase new equipment to enable us to include new sports in our curriculum/as part of our extra-curricular activities – badminton, skipping, parachute games
- Funding will be used to provide places for pupils for after school sport clubs

Our school already offers a range of after school clubs, accessed by children from all year groups. These clubs aim to purposefully to engage new players and beginners, as well as allow children who are more able to play against quality opposition whilst developing their skills to a higher level. We will be using the Sports Funding to offer free places to these clubs.

Key indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport

- Funding will be used to affiliate to the West Berks Sports Network in order to provide children in Y1 – Y6 with opportunities to participate in competitive sports against other schools
- Funding will be used to develop a school football team for boys and girls and enter the NDPSA county cup

Affiliation to the Sports Network will support our participation in the following competitions and arrange tournaments and fixtures between the cluster primaries, allowing the children to compete against other children at a higher level.

Competitions available to affiliated schools in at least 14 different sports (eg Football, Basketball, Athletics, Badminton, Rugby, Bowling, Gymnastics, Netball, Orienteering, Golf, Tennis, Cricket, Dodgeball, Archery). The partnership will fund the affiliation cost annually to Team Kennet, Newbury District Primary Schools Netball Association and Newbury District Primary Football.
